


Christianizing Christmas!

The lack of clean water is a major factor in child deaths in many third world places. Sierra Leone, West Africa is one of those places. We are partnering with World Hope, our Wesleyan Compassion organization, to help dig as many wells in Cambodia and Africa as possible. We will have a one-time offering at the Christmas Eve services. There will be a brief video to clarify the value of this compassion project and even the guests will get it and chip in if they wish. They will feel no pressure, but many will be honored to give. \$10K provides geological studies, equipment, professional well drillers, equipment and training for locals afterward to keep the wells working. AND they have major donors who will add another \$10K to ours to get TWO wells dug. This is really GOOD WORKS. If you want to get in on this but cannot be here Christmas Eve, just put "Wells Project" on your memo.

Facility Use Policy and Guidelines Are Ready to Implement

Beginning the first of the year, we will finally have a welldeveloped policy to guide us in the rental of our wonderful facilities. For several years our buildings have been available for use, even by outside entities, free of charge. This has been our gift to all who have benefitted, but the requests are so many and the cost to the church is mounting for this.

Why have such a policy?

- We are now having to guard the calendar for our church spaces for the increasing number of CCWC initiated programs.
- 2. We are being increasingly inundated with requests, with 6-8 requests per week not being unusual.
- 3. The numbers of requests take staff time to communicate, process, organize, and our staff have tons of other things to do, as well.
- 4. Our building is experiencing the costs of utilities, paid staff to supervise and clean, wear and tear, insurance and even liability risks.
- 5. Therefore, modest use fees may be required along with the privilege of building use. The fees are very modest and still make us the most reasonable facilities in town. Of course, there will *not* be fees for church sponsored events and groups and certain other uses that we consider vital to the enhancement of our mission.

Copies of the policy and fees will be available soon. Scheduling will be done on the basis of the following priorities:

- A. Church-sponsored programs and events have priority
- B. Area groups, ministries and causes that we support have next dibs.
- C. Personal events and events by outside entities rank last. We will avoid events that tends to be oriented to profit making, or personal business issues. We want to stay as close as possible to building use that is consistent with our mission

Our course, we will still readily schedule weddings for modest facility and personnel fees, and we will always make way for funerals, without facility charges.
