

Prayer Ministries

At CCWC we believe in the practice and power of prayer! Our desire is to facilitate a house of prayer by empowering and unleashing people of prayer! With this in mind we have developed several different ministries that focus specifically on engaging in and praying for the needs of church and community. The three main prayer ministries include; an intercessory prayer team that meets each Wednesday to lift up the needs of the church, an intercessory prayer team that meets during each Sunday morning service to lift up the worship service and current congregational needs and a prayer email ministry used to communicate the needs of our congregation to all subscribers who desire to pray over individual needs. Finally, we are currently evaluating our current systems and process to discern how the prayer ministries CCWC can foster discipleship and best service our church family and community moving forward.

CCWC Small Group Ministries

We believe that all Christ-followers thrive by embracing a; One Big (corporate worship experience), One Small (engage in small group fellowship), & One Service (service out of one's "sweet-spot"). With this in mind, CCWC Small Group Ministries attempt to be that "One Small" for our church family. A main key for the Christ-follower who desires to embrace a mission that seeks discipleship is living in a Christian community. The small group ministries of CCWC seek to create an atmosphere of learning, fellowship, discipleship, service, mutual care, and prayer. We facilitate four main types of groups; Community Collective Groups, Classes, Community Groups, and Recreation Groups. You are invited to join any of these small fellowship communities.

Community Collective (CC) Groups

Last year we launched and facilitated a new initiative that expanded our small groups ministries called Community Collective, or "CC" Groups. CC Groups facilitate a "seminar-style small group" set-up around tables in the worship center each Sunday night at 6pm. (Strategically planned to take place during the kids and youth ministries programs.) CC Groups primarily include group fellowship, a video or special presenter, and discussion based on the week's content; all around tables in the worship center. History of Christian Doctrine (A.D. 100 – 600)

Ever wondered about the history of Christian doctrine? How did the Church arrive at the Christian understanding of the Trinity, the incarnation of Christ, or salvation by grace? How did these hard-won understandings of the Christian faith come to be? Why do they matter today? This course will cover these topics from A.D. 100-600, with special emphasis on the historical and doctrinal context of the councils of Nicaea, Constantinople, Ephesus, and Chalcedon. The course will be structured around a lecture and group discussion of graduate-level and primary-source reading assignments. Far from boring, an understanding of the history and development of Christian doctrine will be shown to be an intellectual and spiritual act of worship—an exercise in loving God with one’s mind (Mk 12:30)—as we come to understand what the church of Jesus Christ has taught and believed “ubique, semper, ab omnibus,” and why it matters today.
